BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Consolidation Application (ConApp) is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to county offices, school districts, and district-funded charter schools throughout California. Annually, in May, each local educational agency (LEA) submits the spring release of the application to document participation in these programs and provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs.

The winter release of the application is submitted in January of each year and contains the district entitlements for each funded program. Out of each state and federal program entitlement, districts allocate funds for indirect costs of administration, for programs operated by the district office, and for programs operated at schools.

**Due to the new reporting system (California Application and Reporting System – CARS), the submission of the reports will be in two parts: Winter and Spring.*

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the CARS Winter collection assures funding to the district and schools for supplemental programs/services to staff and students. Approval is recommended.


