BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Transportation Plan

Per Education Code (EC) Section 39800.1, as a condition of receiving apportionments for Transportation Services (under EC Section 41850.1), a local educational agency (LEA) shall develop a plan describing the transportation services. The plan shall be presented and adopted by the governing board of the LEA in an open meeting with the opportunity for public comment. The plan may provide for the LEA to partner with a municipally owned transit system to provide services pursuant to this section to middle school and high school pupils. Nothing in this LEA plan shall preclude a LEA from providing nocost transit passes to pupils.

For Willows Unified School District, this supplemental apportionment results in an additional \$4,368.85.

Consultation with educational partners included Glenn County Air Pollution Control District (March 21st, 2023), DELAC (March 22nd, 2023) and the LCAP Advisory (March 29th, 2023).

Willows Unified School District Transportation Plan 2022-23

Transportation Services:

1. Willow Unified School District (WUSD) provides transportation services to all enrolled students residing in our district at no cost. These essential services are provided through the WUSD transportation fleet, consisting of 3 buses and 6 passenger vans. All district transportation services in support the educational activities of the schools, including curricular, extra-curricular,

Willows Unified School District (WUSD) offers transportation services to meet the needs of all students, including our Unduplicated Students (homeless/foster youth, English Language Learners, socio-economically disadvantaged students, and students with disabilities), in the least restrictive environment and at no cost to students. In addition, transportation tailored to meet the needs of students with disabilities is provided in accordance with the students' Individualized Education Plan, at no cost to the student. This includes services to students with special needs that require/meet the criteria for services of severely

3. Enter description of how unduplicated pupils, would be able to access available home-to-school transportation at no-cost to the pupils. Willows Unified School District (WUSD) offers transportation to all students enrolled in our district, TK-12 and including Unduplicated Students (homeless/foster youth, English Language Learners, socio-economically disadvantaged students, and students with disabilities), at no cost. During the enrollment process at WUSD, parents and guardians are notified of available transportation services, including available options to best meet the needs of the student. Parents have the option to use transportation services as needed.
