BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Consolidated Application (ConApp) is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to Willows Unified School District.

Annually, in the spring, each local educational agency (LEA) submits **Part I** of the application to document participation in these programs and provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs.

Part II of the application is submitted in the fall of each year and primarily contains information related to entitlements, allocations, and numbers of participants in specified programs.

***Due to the new system (California Application and Reporting System - CARS) at CDE, the submission of the Consolidated Application Part II has been delayed by four months.*

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the ConApp assures funding to the district and schools for supplemental programs/services to staff and students. Approval is recommended.
