4. **REPORTS**

- 4.1 Employee Associations (WUTA & CSEA) No reports.
- 4.2 Principals

(WCHS) Dr. Geivett reported:

- Thanksgiving Feast will be held on Tuesday, November 15, 2016 from 10:30 a.m.-noon.
- Current enrollment is 20 students. There are a couple of students who will be coming over from WHS soon.

(WHS) Mr. Johnstone reported:

- Homecoming was awesome.
- Interim CAASPP testing has begun.
- Evaluating our Science programs to see if any changes are needed.
- 37 kids attended a STEM conference at Shasta.
- On November 10th, over 40 students will be attending the Manufacturing Expo in Chico with over 2,000 other students. They will be learning hands on career readiness skills and also looking at what jobs in manufacturing are available for our youth.
- On November 10th, Jen Carriere and Amy Steele will be attending an in-depth course at Butte College regarding new curriculum for the 9th grade.

Mr. Bazan reported:

• Both Football and Volleyball are both the number 1 seeds in our section, so all playoff games will be hosted by WHS. Volleyball will host UPrep on November 8th and then both Football and Volleyball will be playing on November 10th (if Volleyball wins on November 8th). Volleyball Division finals will be held on November 12th (in Red Bluff). Football playoffs will continue on November 18th, and then the championship game will be held on November 23rd. Since both teams could potentially play on November 10th, a decision was made with the coaches to move the Volleyball game to 5:30 p.m. and the Football

game to 7:30 p.m. to allow for people to see both games and for parking. We will have to talk to the athletic directors for the teams we will be playing to make sure they agree to the change in times.

- Mr. Bazan distributed and went over the "Athletic Eligibility-Plus Period Outline". There are two ways students can lose eligibility:
 - o 1) At the end of the quarter/semester, if a student has 2 F's and/or has less than a 2.0, he/she is removed from the team unless the student completes a waiver. A waiver is only available once in a student's 4 years at WHS.
 - 2) If a student receives an F in any class and they are placed in PLUS period for the two week period. Athletes cannot compete with another school (but may practice) unless they bring their grade up OR they demonstrate "diligent" effort in improving the grade (e.g. Pass Port, email, note, flip of plus period, after school with teacher, extra work, etc.). The process is to meet with all athletes who have an F grade on Monday morning of the first week. The Pass Port and Plus Period Flip Form is handed out, and the process is reviewed. Students are encouraged to take ownership and responsibility of their academic achievement. Students must turn in the form with the teacher(s) signature(s) to Mr. Bazan when he/she either raises the grade or shows improvement to the teacher's satisfaction. At that point, students may compete in a game.

Mrs. Taylor raised the concern that this plan allows athletes to play in any competition while a student has an F. She understood from discussion last spring that athletes would not be able to play in any game while they had an F. They should be students first and athletes second. WUSD is seeking to go above and beyond what is currently required in order to improve student achievement which is a good thing. Mr. Geiger feels it should be any student who is involved with an extracurricular activity, not just athletes. After more discussion, Administration will meet with Dr. Geivett, make some changes to the Athletic Eligibility plan as necessary, check the CIF regulations, and bring it back a report to the board next month.

(WIS) Mr. Sailsbery reported:

- On November 17th, four substitutes will come in to allow teachers on a rotation basis to visit colleagues in order to observe their instructional practices.
- On November 4th, 14 girls will be attending a Latina Conference at CSUC.
- Thank you to those who supported the 8th grade fundraiser at Round Table. They earned \$950 on the bake sale and have not yet heard what they earned in pizza sales.
- On November 18th there will be a "Super Fun Day" filled with lots of activities for students as a reward for good behavior.
- Girls' basketball has started.
- Parents are starting up a PTO at WIS. First fundraising activity will be a Sip and Paint night to be held on November 10th at the Willows Elk's Lodge.

- 1. (Information/Discussion) Butte-Glenn Community College AB 288 Dual Enrollment Opportunity. Amy Christianson, with Butte College, distributed a draft partnership agreement and discussed the opportunity that high schools can offer college courses on their campuses. The intent was to focus on socio-economically disadvantaged, ESL and/or foster youth students who may not be considering college, although all students would be eligible to take the classes. This would not replace AP courses, but would expand the opportunity for those students who are considering primarily Career-Technical Education. Butte College currently offers a few classes on the WHS campus, but Butte College cannot count them. This new legislation would allow the dual enrollment. There would be opportunity for teachers of WUSD with master's degrees to be able to teach these courses and remain a WUSD employee. Ms. Christianson will return next month seeking public comment and approval of the agreement.
