IT'S BEEN A GREAT YEAR!

LCFF—2017-18 serves as the last year of "phase in" funding for the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), bringing the district within 2% of full funding. See page 2 for a breakdown of LCFF funding.

Although on paper full funding sounds great, we must keep in mind that the State's definition of full funding is at the 2007-08 levels. California continues to fund school districts well below the national average.

The 2017-18 school year brought great excitement throughout the district, with the first major renovations in years taking place due to the passage of Measure B in 2016! Thank you Willows community!

Murdock Elementary School received new classrooms, a new library -media center, new restrooms and a new staff room. Willows Intermediate obtained new student/staff restrooms, and Willows High School's Measure B construction consisted of air conditioning, revamped locker rooms, and new bleachers in the gym as well as modernization of the cafeteria restrooms and floor. The high school also received a new roof and exterior paint.

Contract negotiations were successfully settled with the Willows Unified Teachers Assn. (WUTA), resulting in a well deserved 7% increase to the salary schedule in 2017-18 and a 1% off schedule payment in 2018-19.

We commend WUTA for requesting that the 1% off schedule payment be split equally among the staff allowing those new to the profession to receive an equal payment to that of veteran staff members.

This allowed the district and WUTA to agree to a 3 year contract with no monetary re-openers until July 1, 2020.

The School Board

approved a transfer of funding into our Technology (Resource 9153) account to allow funding to be pushed out to school sites to continue growth in technology for students. The School Board also supported professional development by tablishing a Professional Development (PD) Program (Resource 9517) that will provide much needed funds over the next five years. This was necessary due to the end of the State's Educator Effectiveness Program and a drastic 50% cut in the federal PD program known as Title II.

In 2017-18 our school board approved the purchase of a new food services van, replacing a 1990 truck that had been used by Willows Unified for more than 20 years.

The district also enhanced our Drivers' Education Program by providing our teacher, Mr. Randy Prinz with a new Ford Focus to use in the behind the wheel training.

We also purchased a new Exiss Livestock trailer for use in our Ag and FFA Programs.





TECHNOLOGY AND SAFETY

Enhanced technology continued to be a priority in 2017-18. The staffing computer rotation schedule was adopted with the goal to make sure no staff member has a system that is older than five years.

Sites were able to increase the number of Chromebook carts by utilizing the last of the Educator Effectiveness carryover, donations, and other district funds.

The district upgraded video surveillance systems and telephones at all sites, purchased a new server, and upgraded our firewall.




