Some staff members at WIS are refusing to support any fundraising efforts that are run through ASB, because they don't want the 3% indirect fee to be charged by the District. WIS – Steve Sailsbery reported:

• Back to School Night was solid. Teachers did a good job of presenting.

- First rally was held on August 31, 2018 and was spirited and enjoyable.
- On the August 29, 2018 Collaboration Day, the staff participated in a "Restorative Practices" workshop.
- Working with the other sites to put together a district technology plan. WIS is reviewing how they currently use technology in the classroom and what they would like to do in the future.

MES – Stephen Montana reported:

- Back to School Night was very well attended.
- Finishing up the ELPAC testing that's given to English learners.
- Eco Hero assembly for grades 2 and 3 will be held on September 19, 2018.
- Anti-bullying assembly will be held on September 20, 2018.
- 4th grade will be going to the Glenn County Fairgrounds on September 19, 2018.
- Math-a-thon will be held on September 21, 2018.
- 4th graders will be going to Eskaton on September 28, 2018, to read to residents.
- MTSS Training will be September 12-13, 2018.
- PBIS conference will be later this month.
- Recently, MES had a Williams Act audit which checks to make sure every student has a textbook for every subject. Recently, MES requested the Board to declare the Science and Social Studies textbooks obsolete, because it doesn't make sense to work out of old textbooks that don't teach to the current standards. Schools are going to be assessed on the new standards. One class set was kept for every grade level in case a teacher wanted to utilize them. MES is teaching the standards for both Science and Social Science. Common Core has forced English Language Arts to provide 50% non-fiction reading to students, so a lot of the Social Studies standards are being taught through Benchmark. Teachers are utilizing "Mystery Science" and "Studies Weekly" for science which are both online programs and are aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards. MES is complying with the Williams Act by having materials for student use. When the curriculum catches up to the standards, there will be textbooks.

WHS – David Johnstone reported:

- Construction is mostly complete, and everyone is loving the new additions.
- Link Crew started off the year on August 6, 2018, with a great welcome for the freshmen. WHS Boosters hosted the BBQ. It was a great event with almost all the freshmen attending.
- New gym was used for the kick off assembly.
- Enrollment is 475 which is up by 25 students from last year.
- ASB voting was a success. They are planning the Battle of the Axe/Mace and homecoming. Roberts Rules of Order have been discussed, and there has been a complete overhaul in ASB to include recording notes, voting, setting procedures and protocols. Thank you to Mrs. Ovitz for taking this on.
- Back to School Night was well attended.
- Homecoming floats will be overseen by teacher class advisors who will also be at each float building.
- Sports teams are off to a great start.
- First couple of topics for collaboration have been focusing on results by creating SMART goals for students by department that are measureable, results oriented and time bound.
- Staff member of the month for August was Jessie Proctor.
- Joe Schantz and Daniel Zintzun are staffing the after school tutorial this year. More students have been attending tutorial as it is not just for students who are required to be there. Most of the time, 6-10 students have been going on a volunteer basis. Last month 15 athletes were required to attend, and so far this month, only one athlete was required to attend.
- MEATS club started a robotics team and is looking for funding for their first competition. Cost is approximately \$2,500 which includes a robot that they must purchase and build. They are looking for sources of funding. Chevron turned the club down, but First Inspires donated \$500. In addition, the Boosters contributed \$1,250 for the purchase of the robot and registration for the first competition. One team will compete in December.
- Yearbook also received \$1,000 from the Boosters to purchase three cameras.
- 14 teachers participated in the first round of Sound Instructional Practices (SIP). They gave up their prep periods to visit other classrooms, looking for best practices to bring back to their classrooms.

WCHS – Dr. Geivett reported:

- Enrollment is 16 students.
- 4.4 Director of State & Federal Programs Ellen Hamilton reported:
 - CAASPP scores are set to be released to the public in mid-September.
 - The California School Dashboard will have a new look and be available for the public in November.

• ELD Master Plan is on the agenda for approval. It is a live, working document and has been updated to meet the ELPAC and ESSA statute requirements.

- Application paperwork for State funding has been sent to CDE still in line for state matching funds. Governor Brown did not okay much of the 9 billion Prop 51 funding. 640 million has been released. Our consultants have said that it looks like we could receive funding in fall of 2019, however, we don't know where we are in line right now.
