Background Information:

The Budget trailer bill (SBX 3 4) gives local school agencies the authority to use the funds received from the state for Tier III programs for "any educational purpose, to the extent permitted by federal law." The flexibility to receive and transfer funds from these program is authorized for five years from 2008-09 through 2012-13.

It is in the best interest of the District to receive all funds available as permitted by SBX 3 4, to unrestricted general fund and to be used for other educational purposes.

As required for the public hearing, we are to take testimony from the public; discuss proposed uses of the funding and approve/disapprove use of funding from the Tier III programs as identified in E.C. 42605.

Recommendations:

Approve our receipt of flexibility transfers as prescribed by the Budget trailer bill (SBX 3 4) approved February 20, 2009 to be used to meet other educational purposes.

WUSD - CATEGORICAL PROGRAM PROVISIONS IN SBx3 4, ENACTED FEBRUARY 20, 2009

The Enacted 2009-10 California State Budget and SBX 3_4, Chapter 12, Statutes of 2009 authorizes school districts and county office's to use funding received from the State for Tier Three programs, for any educational purpose, to the extent permitted by federal law. The flexibility to use funds from these programs is authorized for five years from 2008-09 through 2012-13 by Education Code 42605.

Rationale: The enacted 2009-10 California State Budget reduces funding to education by \$8.6 billion. Education Code 42605 provides school districts and county office's the flexibility to use funds from Tier Three programs to other educational programs as deemed necessary.

The Board is being asked to approve the following acceptance of and use of funds to meet educational needs:
